Newtown and District Male Voice Choir Concert – St. Tyssil's Church on Saturday 20th June at 7.30

On June 14th 2008, over 150 people attended a concert in St Tyssil's Church by Newton Male Voice Choir and the party afterwards in the Hall. The evening was a spectacular success.

The Church wardens have once again kindly agreed that the Church can be used and the Choir will come back to Llandyssil for a repeat performance on Saturday 20th June, starting at 7.30. Tickets are available from any Hall Trustees at £6 a ticket.

The evening promises to be a delight. In addition to the wonders of the choir, there will be various soloists including Glen Lloyd, our local guitar vocalist, and Paul Sawtell a jazz pianist who has worked with Shirley Bassey and, for two years, with the Kenny Ball Jazz Band. Refreshments will be available in the Hall following the concert – and of course the Upper House will be open at the end of the evening.

Do come and join us. It promises to be wonderful evening.

Llandyssil Old School Hall

Work on re-slating the Hall roof and opening up of the rafters has now been completed. The flat roof above the kitchen has also been replaced. The old floor which was knotted and uneven has been replaced with a new temporary floor which is better for users – especially the line dancers. Proper insulation has been placed under the floor to provide better protection. Sound proofing of the party wall with School House cottage is still to be completed.

Grants have now been applied for for the next phase of renovation which will include a new high quality oak floor, double glazing of windows, rewiring, work on panelling and plastering and a new heating system. At this stage the capital costs of installing an environmentally innovative under floor heating system appear unrealistic especially in terms of relatively low Hall usage. This will be reviewed in the future. If, with the guidance and support of Cllr Wynne Jones, we can get the funding for Phase 2, the objective is to have all Phase 2 works completed by end March 2010 which will complete the obligations under the lease.

The Hall is now VAT registered and the Hall's finances are healthy with approximately £5,000 in the bank account, once all grant funds and VAT refund have been received and invoices paid.

There are two new trustees – both representing Hall users – Dave ‘The Rave’ Hamer (Line dancers) and Alan Jefferies (T’ ai Chi).

The Annual General Meeting will take place at 7.30 on Wednesday 3rd June. At that meeting Andrew Lloyd will take over as Chair of the Trustees, the agreement being that the Chair should change each year. Everyone is welcome – and we do want to hear as many views and ideas as possible. Please join us if you can.

PACT meeting (Partnerships and Communities Together)

There was a well attended PACT meeting held in the Old School Hall at 7pm on Wednesday 25th March, with around 40 people from Llandyssil and Abermule joining representatives of the Police and other community groups. Specific concerns discussed included speeding between the Village cross roads and the Chapel cross roads – a route used by many walkers, an increase in the number of probably Satnav directed lorries using the road and sharp bends past Phipps Tenement, the need for signs to ask motorists and cyclists to drive carefully through the village and what can be done regarding the filthy road through Court Calmore Farm.

This is a very safe area but in view of opportunists and travelling criminals the Police recommended that doors should be locked and care taken, especially by older people. They asked that advantage be taken of the Bobby Van scheme - a free service for senior citizens to survey and to fit additional security if required. Llandyssil Walking Group

Due to finances, the work Powys County Council were undertaking on Public Rights of Way and Footpaths in Churchstoke had to be temporarily put on hold until the new financial year. Work there has now commenced again but having fallen behind, the expected work on footpaths in and around Llandyssil will not be taking place just yet.

Also, due to finances the Council is an area officer down and a reshuffle has taken place. The new area officer for the area including Llandyssil is Calum Carr (calum.carr@powys.gov.uk) who has previously covered north East Montgomeryshire. He will now be taking on a larger work area. He has agreed however, to undertake works in Llandyssil as the new priority community when the Churchstoke area has been completed.

Whilst works have been ongoing in Churchstoke, the Council has been sorting out any anomalies in Llandyssil that are apparent on the Definitive Map to make more sense of the Right of Way network ready for the time when the area will be the priority community.

Last year a grant was offered for a Walks notice board. Not wishing to turn down funding, this was put up on the bus shelter. Once the above work on footpaths has been completed a large scale map will be put in the notice board showing the various routes from the village.

Gardeners' Notebook

Well Spring is finally here after a long cold winter. The daffodils are looking wonderful, not only in our own gardens but also on the verges. It is well worth driving or walking through Cefn y Coed to see the large number of bright yellow heads nodding along the verge, they appear to go on forever.

It is a very busy time for Gardeners. A time that we can divide those over-grown Perennials, stake the tall plants (get those stakes in before the plants are too large), mulch the borders and not to forget those persistent weeds and the annual pruning and feeding the roses – and that's just the flower borders! We also have to plant the vegetables, the patch needs to be dug over (if not done in the winter), fertilizer needs to be sprinkled on, stakes need to be put in place in preparation for the runner beans, the potatoes should have been sufficiently chitted to plant now, seeds need to be sown.

This may be all hard work but it is also great fun especially when the vegetables and plants start to appear through the soil and the seeds start to germinate – we then know that it has all been worth-while. I always think that we also need a reward for our hard work so a visit to the Garden Centre to buy an extra plant – or more if you have space! is a must at this time of year.

The gardening club started the new season with a very interesting talk in March by the new Head Gardener of Powys Castle Gardens. On April 9th we have a talk on “Cottage Gardens”, May 14th our topic will be Barn Owls.

We have two outings this year. On June 11th when we will be visiting the Roman Vineyard in Wroxeter (near Shrewsbury). Community News

Report from your County Councillor.

At last we have finally completed the much needed lay-by on the entrance road into the village. It is four years since I placed this in the Minor Works Capital Programme, so I am fairly relieved that this has finally come to fruition. I can also report that there will be no change of priority at Chapel Crossroads, but instead there are improved markings at the junction, which should help alleviate safety concerns.

Adjustments to the street lights took place in early March as a result of the review. This has resulted in more lights being on up to 12.30am., but then the majority of lights go off until 5.30am. The adjustments means that the Brooklyn Estate have lights back on at last, the original programme left them without any lights at all. This was an error and I can only apologise for that.

I am delighted with the outcome of Phase 1 works for the Village Hall and I have been working with Hall Committee to identify funding for Phase 2. The applications are now in and the applications that fall within my Portfolio responsibility should receive consent within the next few weeks. Hopefully this will lead to a completion of the restoration of the Hall during 2009/10 financial year, and the result will be a village amenity that everyone can be proud off.

On wider note, for information, some charges for car parking in Powys CC car parks will increase in April. The Board discussed the issue on Tuesday last the light that a further £100k of revenue had to be found in this budget. However, it was decided not to increase charges across the board, but to leave short stay unchanged. Long stay charges will increase from £2.20 to £2.40 and permits from £120 per year to £150. In addition several car parks across Powys that are currently free, will now be included for charge. Apart from providing extra income, this will make the car parking situation across the County more equitable and lead to better management of those car parks.

Finally may I inform you that I have launched my own web-site in order to provide a source of information to constituents on a regular basis. On my web-site you will find information about the political and decision making structure of the Council, as well as up to date information on local issues and Powys-wide issues. Abermule with Llandyssil Community Council

Land behind Brooklyn

Following a request from residents, the Community Council have explored the possibility of improving the land behind Brooklyn. This is in order that it can be used far more effectively by the youth of the area for sports.

The improvement will entail a quantity of soil being spread over the surface in areas to upgrade the playing area which at present has a number of stony sections that are unsuitable from playing football and other sports.

A number of residents in the area have made contact with the Council relating to damaging the bank of the stream with the conveying of the top soil to the land at the rear of Brooklyn which could cause flooding if damaged. We have taken this into account and have spoken to our contactor who has assured us that he will reduce the size of the trailer he uses and will use double axle trailers whenever possible thereby spreading the gross weight which in turn will put less weight when travelling over the sensitive parts.

We as a Council when this top soil is in place then intend to power harrow and re-seed the area to make it fit for purpose.

Handy Person

From April you will see two new additions to our team. We have employed on a contractual basis two individuals one covering Abermule and one covering Llandyssil,

whose duties will be to inspect the plays areas in Llandyssil and Abermule, general maintenance i.e. fence painting etc. part of their duties will also to ensure that there is no litter in the play areas or bus shelters and to make certain that refuse bins and doggie bins are regularly emptied. A number of doggie bins are on order to prevent dog mess causing a problem. The Council urge dog owners to use these bins thereby responsibly disposing of their dog's mess

School Garden

A request was made to the Council from the friends of Abermule School for financial assistance to enable pupils of Abermule School to start a garden at the rear of the school. This would draw together all ages those learning and those with knowledge guiding the youngsters. This initiative would go a long way in village to enhance community cohesion. It is with much pleasure that Abermule Council can announce that we have awarded for £1300 to this worthy project.

Power lines

There is an exhibition in Forden Community Centre on Wednesday 22 April and in Montgomery Town Hall on Thursday 23 April both from 2-8 pm regarding the proposed Llandinam Windfarm Connection from Bryn Dadlau to Welshpool substation. This power line passes through the Parish of Llandyssil. The purpose of the exhibition is to provide feedback. No planning application has yet been submitted.
